


Barkology was born out of warm and cherished memories of my own childhood dogs, but it was invigorated by reflecting on my daughter's fifth birthday present, Skye.


She just has a way. You know, she gives that warm feeling looking at you with loving eyes, and her calm nature makes her such a beautiful family member.


She likes to dig but doesn't DIG a hole in the lawn... just takes the green grass layer off the top.


She loves snuggle up on the couch with us while watching TV, but if we are on screens, she hits us with her paw and stares intensely at us to make us look up!


Once, she ate half a family-sized block of Cadbury chocolate while we were sleeping.


We love atching him play with the kids - whether it's chasing bubbles, trying to get around the fort they've created, or simply watching them play fetch together.


Rua taps his paw on Mum Suzanne's shoulder when they are asleep if he is hungry or wants to play in the morning!





Toy Cavoodles


Jack and Molly were born almost exactly a year apart and were very welcome additions to our family during the pandemic.

Actually, we had so many laughs during our photoshoot because that was Nala's first "puppuccino," and she went mad for it!





The kids were absolutely drawn to him. He was a little playful as well as very loving and soft. We knew he would fit right into our family.


Blu likes to chase his tail, and when he does this, he often rolls/falls over, making everyone laugh so much.

Louis, Frankie, Rosie & Ralphy


Miniature Schnauzers






